FS2 classes

This term FS2's topic is, 'Will you be my friend'? Part of the topic is to look at People Who help Us. After listening to the children's ideas of who helped look after them, we arranged visits from our Caretaker, Office staff and Cleaners. They came into classrooms and the children asked them questions about their jobs. On Tuesday the children had an exciting visit from Katie, who is a paramedic at the Medical Centre. She drove to school in her ambulance, which the children had the opportunity to explore. She also talked about her job and how she helped looked after people who were ill or injured. Katie showed the children her 'medical toolkit' bag. She modelled how to test their temperature, listen to their heartbeat and check their throat. The children enjoyed telling her stories of when they had hurt themselves and that they were brave, and that they didn't cry.



<u>Y1 classes</u>

Year 1 children have had a fantastic start to the year. We have all settled in well and are working hard. We have enjoyed looking at our class story about 'Pete the Cat' and his brand new white shoes. We have enjoyed joining in with singing Pete's song and are really good at retelling it! After writing sentences about Pete's story, we have now started to innovate the story and add our own ideas. We have also been buying shoes in our shoe shop, drawing Pete on the computers and using pens, designing some new shoes for Pete and creating zig-zag books!







<u>Y2 classes</u>

In Year 2 we launched our 'Muck, Mess and Mixtures' topic this week with a fantastic 'Messy Monday Morning'! We squidged and slopped and glooped and squelched our way through an exciting array of hands-on (and feet-on) activities, and had a thoroughly messy time!

<u>Y3 classes</u>

Year 3 children have launched into their topic 'Scrumpdiddlyumptious' with great enthusiasm. We were all lucky enough to receive chocolate bars from the Great Willy Wonka himself, and these contained golden tickets. We are now well on our way with our adventure in chocolate. In English, we have started studying the book 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory', with a focus on setting descriptions.

This week we started experimenting with chocolate and by the end of the half term we will have created our own chocolate bars.

<u>Year 4 classes</u>

The children have all settled in well and are getting used to the new routines. But...a strange thing happened on Monday! There was a terrible mess left outside the Year 4 classrooms. We followed a trail with clues; it led to a weird scene! 'Double, double toil and trouble Fire burn, and cauldron bubble.' Year 4 learned this poem and we are now writing our own magic spell poem. This will engage the children for our Topic called "Potions".





<u> Y5A – Escher Class</u>

I am extremely impressed with how all the children in Escher class have settled so well into the new school year. Our topic for this half term of 'Peasants, Princes and Pestilence' has got off to a flying start this week with us meeting the gruesome character of pestilence.

<u>Y5R – Van Gogh class</u>

The Van Gogh class has settled into Year 5 life extremely quickly. They are all fully engaged with our half-term topic of 'Peasants, Princes and Pestilence' (certainly the personification of the Black Death appears to have left a lasting image in their young imaginations!) The atmosphere in class is wonderful and we hope the environment will soon show the full potential of all class members; helping them shine and make excellent progress across the curriculum.

Archaeological dig at Dreamer's Bay

This week some of our Y3/Y4 pupils had the opportunity to visit the archaeological dig at Dreamer's Bay. The site is being excavated by a joint venture between the University of Leicester and Operation Nightingale, to further explore the history of the region.

Our pupils explored the site, talked with the archaeologists and watched them at their work, ordered a timeline and even took part in a dig themselves! We then returned to Akrotiri School where we learnt how to predict the scale of pots from small pieces and draw what they might have looked like.



<u>Y6 class</u>

Year 6 also visited the archaeological site.

Important safety/medical notes and reminders for Akrotiri School

Important Message from School Nurse

If your child has a current medical condition for which they require emergency medication to be held in school (asthma inhalers / adrenaline auto-injectors/ antihistamine), please ensure that this is brought into the school office.

Any medicines must have a pharmacy prescription label attached and be in date.

<u>Sickness Bug</u>

A reminder about returning to school following illness:

In line with NHS recommendations and best practise in UK schools, children with diarrhoea and / or vomiting should be absent from school for a minimum of 48 hours after their symptoms have gone.

This period of time helps to stop the spread of infection to other children and staff.

It is important to inform us as early as possible, if your child is going to be absent. We ask for your co-operation in this matter. Thank you.

Parking And Drop Off – Foundation And Main School Car Parks

Could we remind all parents the school drop off and parking arrangements, designed to help improve child safety, are in either the sports pavilion car park, by the small rank of shops (florist, hairdressers etc), or in the main Ermes car park and escort their children into the school grounds.

Main school front car park is for school staff only. Foundation car park is for school staff only.



<u> Playground Equipment</u>

As per our risk assessment, children are closely supervised by prescribed ratios of staff during play and, it is for this reason that we <u>must ask parents not</u> <u>to allow any children to use the equipment during drop off and pick</u> up times, as these are not supervised by staff.

We do realise that the area is very inviting to children but we would like to ask for your cooperation on this matter. Thank you.

Safe Use Of Scooters And Bikes

We would like all pupils to stay safe at all times. Please wear a helmet when riding your bike or scooter.

Please walk with your bike/scooter while you are on school grounds.

Please take care when riding around camp especially near crossings and at the bottom of the hills near to school.

There have been a few incidents of pupils not being safe recently so could all parents also assist us by reminding any child they see acting in an unsafe manner that the rules are in place to ensure everyone's safety.

<u>Dogs in School</u>

May we remind you that dogs are not permitted anywhere on the school grounds. Although largely well behaved and patient, they can be intimidating for small children or anyone who is unused to dogs.

We also ask that in addition, dogs are not tethered to our boundary fences during drop-off and pick-up. This includes the wire-fenced area opposite the front of Foundation Stage.





<u>Smoking</u>

Akrotiri School and Foundation Stage grounds are designated as nonsmoking areas. This includes the use of e-cigarettes.
