## Head Teacher Update

### Dear Parents/Carers,

### Staffing

Every school experiences staff changes at the end of the school year and we are no exception. We are delighted that Mr Bowles is now a permanent member of the Akrotiri team, as he was previously appointed on a fixed term contract. We have also successfully appointed a replacement for Mrs Harvey as she is sadly leaving us to return to the UK this summer. She has been a valued member of our team for several years and she will be missed by pupils and staff. Her position as Phase Leader for KS1 and Science Leader will now be filled by Mr Bennington in Year 2. This means that we now have a vacancy for a Year 2 teacher which I aim to fill as soon as possible.

#### School Fence

I would like to start by thanking everyone for their patience and support as we have begun the trial of our new fence procedures. We have experienced several glitches — day one was not much fun when the front gate wouldn't open at one point! This was because we hadn't yet mastered the many handsets that can open the gate and get them working together. #### Classroom Access

Following the letter to all Year 1 – Year 3 parents this week, I would like to remind all parents that access to the classroom for both pupils and parents is only during school hours. Immediately before and after school, pupils and parents must seek permission from the teacher if they wish to access the classroom for any reason. No parent or child are allowed into classrooms without the teacher present. Please can all parents remain on the playground with their child until the bell has rung. The children will then be collected and taken to the classroom by their teacher. We want all the children to develop their independence by going alone with the teacher and getting themselves ready for the day ahead.

#### **SATs**

We have had a very busy couple of weeks with our Year 6 and Year 2 pupils taking their annual SATs tests. I am pleased to report that all our pupils have coped very well with the pressure of completing the tests and we are looking forward to receiving the results shortly. I would like to thank all our Year 6 and Year 2 teachers for the hard work and support they always provide their pupils in such important years. I would also like to thank our caretaker George who made toast for breakfast each morning for Year 6 pupils. This allowed us to give them additional support when they first arrived in addition to ensuring that they were fully fuelled before the tests began!

## **New School Nurse**

We say a fond farewell to Mrs Andrea Mason, SSAFA Children's Community Nurse (our School Nurse), who shortly moves to pastures new with her family and in turn welcome Mrs Jennie McPhee who has taken on this vital role within our school community.

The SSAFA Community Health Team, are located in the building behind the Station Medical Centre. Like Andrea, Jennie has various roles and responsibilities as a School Nurse. Here are just a few of the services delivered at Akrotiri School:

- Completing Individual Healthcare Plans for children in school with medical conditions such as Asthma, Eczema, allergies and seizures.
- Providing annual training for all staff on Asthma and inhaler use, recognising and treating allergies and anaphylaxis.
- Carrying out National Childhood Measurement Programme heights and weights of all children in FS2 & Y6.
- School entry hearing Screening and Health Questionnaires in FS2.
- Nasal Flu Vaccination Programme (currently Y1 & Y2) in school.
- Delivery of health promotions / health education campaigns and other topics in assembly, e.g. Sun Safety, Healthy Eating and Water is Cool.

Jennie works closely with other health professionals across BFC and can refer or signpost to other agencies if necessary.

If your child has a current medical condition for which they require emergency medication to be held in school (asthma inhalers / adrenaline auto-injectors/anti-histamine), please ensure that this is removed from school at the end of each term; brought into the school office at the beginning of each new term and regularly checked for expiry dates.

Any medicines must have a pharmacy prescription label attached in your child's name and be in date.


A huge 'thank you' to Sarah, for generously sharing her knowledge and time, to make this wonderful activity happen.



Year 1 have had a fantastic half term learning about dinosaurs. We started off our topic by digging for fossils at the back of the school.

We had to wear special gloves and be really careful as the bones were millions of years old.

We found everything from leg bones to a full sized skull!





**Year 2** have loved learning about their new topic of Land Ahoy, finding out about pirates, explorers and pioneers.

We've written postcards and biographies, and mapped where different explorers went. This week, we have been showing what amazing learners we are and have completed our SATs!





Year 3 are enjoying their topic 'Predator'. We have been finding out about food chains and predators. In English lessons we have been reading about the Krindlekrax, a crocodile that grows into a huge monster. When we went to Paphos Zoo we saw lots of predators including crocodiles, lions and tigers.

In Art lessons we painted predator cats, we are very proud of this work. Soon we will be creating our own predator creatures.

Watch out there are predators about!



Year 4's current topic is 'Misty Mountain Sierra' – this project's main focus is Geography.

To launch the topic we did a fabulous treasure hunt. Then we studied maps of the school and Cyprus, used 4 and 6 figure grid references and created our own treasure hunts around the school. We have also looked at compasses.

The children have learnt all about mountains around the world; which continents they are in and how high they are. The children now know how to use atlases and what a mountain looks like on a map. We also found out that some people think that a hill becomes a mountain at 300m, others at 600m.

We have also found out about how rivers are formed. All this will culminate in our Educational visit to the Troodos region to see mountains for ourselves.

It has been a really busy half-term for **Year 5**, which reaches its climax in the penultimate week with a three-day residential trip to the Akamas peninsula. The children have thoroughly enjoyed the preparations, discussing their hopes and fears for, what for many, will be the first time away without their parents. The visit fits in well with our topic of 'Allotments', as the Kritou Terra Environmental Studies Centre team will lead the children through ideas of local land use (both ancient and modern). So, what started with making soup will hopefully end with making memories!





Year 6 as they completed their SATS. They started each day with a breakfast in the School Hall before sitting their tests.

The children worked incredibly hard and gave their all - we are very proud of them all. We finished the week off with a day of fun and relaxation - a great time was had by all bowling and then swimming.
