

On Thursday the 2nd of November we had a very exciting day in FS2. It all began when we went on a nature hunt in the school grounds to find sticks suitable for making magic wands. We had a lovely time searching high and low for the items and luckily we found them all!!! We finished off our exciting day with a spooktacular Halloween disco in the School Hall!



Last week Y1 were having a whole year group story. Suddenly we heard a ringing noise. After looking around we found a bag. Inside the bag there were lots of mysterious objects. We worked out that the objects belonged to a superhero called Storm. He needed our help. He had left us a note and a video which told us that his powers had been stolen and he needed our help!







Last week an astronaut visited Year 2 to launch the space part of our 'Land Ahoy' topic. He talked about how he stays alive in space and he showed us his suit and helmet.

On Wednesday, Year 3 went to Choirokitia Stone Age settlement and Tenta Neolithic site at Kalavassos as part of their Tribal Tales Stone Age theme.

They explored reconstructed round houses —even seeing a 'skeleton!' and climbed onto the hill to learn about the ruins and the position of the village.

This was followed by a visit to Tenta at Kalavassos where several incomplete buildings were viewed from the raised platform. Everyone enjoyed the day and they learned a lot!

Year 4 have been learning all about the Ancient Celts; on Wednesday we had a Celtic day. We were tribe Iceni which was Boudicca's tribe. Queen Boudicca told us to do our jobs and the first job was shelling beans. To shell beans you need to get a bean pod then peel it, then put the beans in a wooden bowl.

The outside activity was grinding wheat to make flour. It sounds easy but it actually wasn't. We put a sprinkling of wheat on the floor and bashed it with a rock. Because the wheat was so hard, it was a challenge to do. The flour that we made was not very much and it was all gritty. Making bread was really hard because we had to make the dough, knead the dough, let it rise then knead it again. We cut up lots of vegetables; there were carrots, courgettes, cauliflower and beans. The vegetables were made into Celtic soup, we tasted it. It was really nice.

We learned that being a Celt was really hard work and that we had to do everything ourselves. The children were amazing and had a go at all the activities. What a great day!







Last week, Year 5 learnt about the process of mummification. During ancient Egyptian times the gruesome process of mummification was used to prepare the dead for their journey to the afterlife, where they would live in peace and tranquillity for eternity. The photos show how the children re-enacted the different stages of cleaning the body, removing all of the internal organs and the brain, dehydrating the body before it was then stuffed with rags and sawdust and then finally wrapping the body in metres of bandages before it was safely placed in the coffin. They will be using their historical understanding in their English work over the next few weeks as the children will be writing detailed explanation texts on the process of mummification.











In their English lessons, Year 6 have been focussing on the work of William Wordsworth. They have produced some fabulous examples of diaries and journals based upon the famous daffodils poem— 'I Wandered Lonely as a Cloud.' They have worked hard to understand some of the archaic vocabulary in it, identify examples of figurative language features and also to use them within their own writing. They then looked at another of his poems – 'Composed during a Storm,' and used this as a stimulus for writing their own diary entry.
