
#### <u> School Photographer- Bentleys FS1-Y6</u>


## FS2 visit from the Fire Section

This week the FS2 children had the fantastic opportunity to meet some of the people who work at the Fire Section. They talked to the children about the different roles of their job and also how the children can help keep themselves safe at home. The firefighters brought with them, some of the specialist equipment they use. The children attempted putting out a fire, under the close supervision of the fire fighters.

Last week, Year 1 went to the zoo! We saw lots of different animals including meerkats, otters, a hippo, a baby monkey and a crocodile. We had a talk from the zoo keeper and even got to see and touch a snake! We had a great time!







Year 2 have loved finding more about explorers recently, particularly Captain Cook and Captain Scott. We have been super writers recently too-writing instructions for 'How to trap a Sea Monster' and we are just about to complete our Lost and Found stories.

Let's not forget our super learning about animal adaptation - some new creatures might be on the way!!



This week, Year 3 presented their classes assembly to Key Stage 2. They explained what they had found out about chocolate and linked their work in Geography and English to produce a report to compare living conditions in a village in Ghana and England.

They also showed how they had drafted designs and created boxes for chocolate.



**Year 4** have had another busy week – We are learning our times tables, working out division facts and solving problems in Maths.

In English we are extending sentences using fronted adverbials and expanded noun phrases.

Science is all about different states of matter and how to do a really scientific experiment. We have designed and carried out our own experiment about melting ice.

# News from Year 5 Reported by Rosa Baker and Kyra Leirer

On Thursday 28th September, we had a fascinating day in Year 5 being archaeologists studying artefacts from the time of the Ancient Egyptians. We dressed up in fabulous costumes and Mr Parr took small groups out to the Foundation Stage playground, to hunt hidden treasures inside the sandpit of which there were many! We had to work together as a team to find all of the artefacts and bring them to the table for further investigation where we posed interesting questions that could be used to support our research into each of the different objects that were found. Later in the day, we used the surface pros to conduct more in depth research on the artefacts that we had discovered. This research will then be used to write an informative paragraph about the artefacts we found and their significance during Ancient Egyptian times. Towards the end of the day, we had an Egyptian dip tasting session. There were three different types of dips: beetroot and yogurt, cucumber and yogurt and hummus. We tried all of them by dipping breadsticks and pitta bread into the different dips. One or two of them were actually quite tasty which was surprising! When asked if she had enjoyed the day Rosa replied, "The day was really fun and I really enjoyed the dig!"



Last Tuesday Year 6 had a Victorian School morning. The two Year 6 classes came together and experienced a series of Victorian style lessons. Mr Collins became a Victorian teacher and kept order, teaching in a very draconian style.

The morals of the time were much in evidence - 'Children should be seen and not heard' being one example. The children went along with the whole experience brilliantly and added to their knowledge of Victorian education.
