Some children took part in the 'Bake for Brake' cake competition and the winners are:



We have been identifying the footprints with a spotter's guide to dinosaurs and rounding them up by their 100's. We are hoping that they have all been captured. But you never know......!














Maths Workshop

It has been a busy week with a trip to the cinema and celebrations for the School's Commendation. Next stop ... Christmas Nativity!








