London's burning, London's burning. Fetch the engines, fetch the engines. Fire Fire, Fire Fire!

During the last two weeks **Y1** have transported ourselves back in time to Sunday, 2nd September 1666 and have been learning about the historical events, places and people from the time of the Great Fire of London.

We have been writing a diary entry, like Samuel Pepys, discussing the senses and emotions we may have encountered whilst living in London during this tragic event.

In preparation for our year group trip to the Fire Section after half term, we have built our own Tudor houses ready to use for when we emulate this enormous historical fire (under close supervision).



Year 2 have loved learning about castles in different ways recently; we have found out about the features of castles and why they are important, designing our own coat of arms including choosing appropriate symbols, investigating flowering plants, beans and cress and trying to grow our own beanstalk to the castle in the clouds, designing and making our own fortress, persuading customers to visit Cyprus Land and also realising that Jack was the baddie in 'Jack and the Beanstalk', so we re-wrote the story to show this.

We cannot wait to share our stories with the children in FS2! Wowzers!











Year 3 pupils have been busy during maths week on a wide range of activities from money to measures and from tessellations to trails.

We have calculated totals and differences, worked out costs and change solving problems along the way on our own, with a partner and as part of small groups.

They have had great fun making 'partner balances' with each other in their gymnastics lessons. They explored different ways of counter-balancing in pairs and made various shapes with their partners.
