Hello parents and children of Akrotiri School,

The temperature is hotting up so I want to take this opportunity to remind us of what we can do to stay safe in the glorious Cypriot sun.

Slip! on a shirt (at school the uniform covers that one)

Slap! on a hat (no hat, no play)

Slop! on sunscreen (Factor 50 water resistant every morning before school)

Slide! on sunglasses (they are allowed in school, they need to have CE marked labels to guarantee UV protection)

Also feeling dizzy, tired, having headaches and your urine will decrease in volume and go darker.

Talking of urine, this month I'm launching the new 'wee charts' in the school assemblies. Look out for them in every loo around school — yes, the staff loos too ①.

Workshop 1 - Think like a Scientist

This workshop uncovers new types of scientists by breaking down the myths and stereotypes. Children will predict, experiment and observe during interactive STEM demonstrations.

Workshop 2 - Change the world with engineering

Children will learn about the different kinds of engineering, some of the specific scientific principles behind it and how it transforms the world around us. The interactive session includes hands-on demos, myth busting and an interactive bridge building activity.

Workshop 2 - Change the world with engineering continued

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Workshop 3 – Soldiers possessions

An interactive activity to will help children appreciate that non-textual sources such as artefacts are an important source of information from the past. Children will work in groups to investigate four genuine objects which were among the personal possessions of a soldier fighting in the trenches during World War 1.
