#### **ORDER NO 15: USE OF ELECTRIC SCOOTERS**

The use of electric scooters is prohibited under the Motor Vehicle and Road Traffic Ordinance of 2006. SBA Police will stop personnel who are riding scooters on public highways or pavements and in the first instance issue a warning with education. Persistent offenders will then face a court summons. SSOs will also be updated that the use of electric scooters on public highways are prohibited within RAF Akrotiri.
