Our learning this term...

Writing: This half term, we will be writing recounts, letters, poetry and narrative stories with speech. This will include using a rich vocabulary and a range of sentence structures to create setting, characters and plots for stories, as we as proof-reading for spelling, grammar, and punctuation errors Maths: We will be Consolidating 2,3,4,5 and 8 times tables, multiplying and dividing 2 digits by 1 digit, dividing hundred into equal parts, dividing with remainders, scaling, counting and converting pounds and pence, adding and subtracting money, making tally charts and drawing pictograms. We will link our **history** to our Geography topics and we will be looking at the events of Ad 79 in Pompeii. Then we will look at everyday life in Cyprus during Roman times.

In geography, we will be learning to describe the properties of the Earth's layers, explaining how a volcano is formed and what happens when it erupts. We will discuss the risks and benefits of living near a volcano and how to keep save when earthquakes occur.

In science, we are going to compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and physical properties; describe how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock and recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter.

In music, we will use an online programme, Charanga, to keep a steady beat on an instrument in a group or individually, and maintain a rhythmic or melodic ostinato simultaneously with a different ostinato and/or steady beat.

Our French learning will see us read and say simple words and phrases relating to introducing ourselves (eg name, age, numbers to 10, brothers and sisters) and count to 20.

This term's PSHE focus is on 'Aspiration' and 'Resilience'. We will learn how to set achievable goals for ourselves and how these provide a focus, excite and motivate us. We will explore and identify skills on how to 'bounce back' and discuss strategies on how to deal with negative results and stress.

Finally, in **RE**, we will be thinking about words of wisdom, 'What wise sayings do we know?', 'Where do we get our wise words from?', 'Where can we get spiritual words of comfort and wisdom?'

Visits and enrichment

We will be enhancing our learning using Forest School, linking our learning where possible to other areas of the curriculum. We are currently unable to offer external trips due to Covid restrictions.

Home learning

Homework will go out every Friday and will need to be returned by the following Wednesday. Reading, spelling and math work will be set every week alongside a science, history, geography or art task.

Reading

It is important that your child's reading book and reading record comes into school every day. They will work to improve their reading skills through individual, shared and guided reading sessions. The children take a quiz each time they complete a book to assess their level of comprehension.

How to help your child

Please support your child with their homework and encourage them to aim high and produce neat work of a good standard.

Please also read with / listen to your child reading regularly and comment and sign in the reading diary.

Remember to question them about what they have read and make it a pleasurable experience.
