Seuss, Grimm and Anderson Classes Autumn 2 2021/2022 - Information Guide



Our learning this term:

This half term, our focus will be developing our stamina for writing and becoming more reflective learners.

Writing: Our first writing unit is based on Remembrance and we will look at the features of a letter before replying with our own. We will then complete a non-fiction unit in which we will explore the features of explanation texts. Finally, we will use the theme of Christmas to write haikus. In phonics, we will continue to recap phase 5 sounds to prepare for the phonics screening, which will take place at the beginning of December.
Maths: We will continue to build on our knowledge of addition and subtraction using concrete, pictorial and abstract resources. We will then begin to develop our knowledge of multiplication and division. We will also start to learn the 2, 5 and 10-times table facts.

In other subjects, we will look at the topic of Remembrance in history, before moving on to build on our science knowledge as we complete work on animals including humans.
