- * Begin to articulate thoughts and ideas in simple sentences, taking turns to speak

Physical Development

- * Use the toilet independently
- * Pull up their own pants, put on their socks and shoes
- * Skip, hop and stand on one leg
- * Move at a variety of paces with control
- * Show a preference for a dominant hand
- * Show some general control over a pencil and some small tools

<u>Literacy</u>

- * Talk about stories
- * Choose to share a book with an adult
- * Hold a book the correct way around and turn the pages one at a time
- * Pay attention to a whole class / group story and enjoy sharing a collective story
- * Begin to join in rhymes
- * Show an interest in mark making

Mathematics

- * Join in with number rhymes
- * Show finger numbers to 3
- * Begin to subitise with 3
- * Begin to use the language of measures within their play
- * Understand position through words, eg behind

Understanding the World

- * Use their senses to explore natural materials and loose parts
- * Talk about what they see using a widening vocabulary beginning to describe / identify similarities and differences
- *Begin to make sense of their own life story, talking about photos of themselves and their family

Expressive Arts and Design

- * Join different materials and explore different textures
- * Explore colour and colour mixing
- * Remember and sing entire songs, including nursery rhymes
