



Lovelace, Hawkings and Johnson classes Summer 1 2023 - Information Guide



This half term, in Year 4, our focus will be on the Vikings, followed by sculpture and food technology.

Writing: We will be looking at diaries. We will look at a range of diaries, identifying the features before having a go at writing our own Viking diary! Following on from diaries, we will look at a Vikings story and retell part of the story using and applying our knowledge of direct speech.

Maths: We will be continuing to look at fractions, this time focussing on equivalent fractions and addition and subtraction of fractions. We will then move onto decimals where we will look at tenths and hundredths as decimals.

Other areas of the curriculum:

In history, we will be focussing on the Vikings, looking at their invasion in Britain. We will look at how they struggled against the Anglo Saxons to claim Great Britain, before looking at the events building up to the death of Edward the Confessor in 1066.

Following a trip to Ayia Napa Sculpture Park, where we will observe, sketch and evaluate different sculptures, we will further investigate different artists before having a go at different clay techniques including carving, slabbing and joining clay.

We will end the half term with food technology. We will look at Viking food, where children will develop their cooking techniques, combing ingredients to make and evaluate a Viking dish.

VISITS AND ENRICHMENT

To start off our art topic, we are planning a visit to Ayia Napa Sculpture Park.

We also have our Year 4 residential at the end of the half term! A parent meeting for this visit will be held later on in the half term – dates to be confirmed.
