Children confidently talked through the process of skills development and how they had experimented in their sketch books to perfect texture, blending and colour before producing their final pieces on canvas. As we hit December today, I have heard of many elves appearing, spreading Christmas havoc across the station; in school there has been a sprinkling of Christmas too.
